### **JGHS Parent Council finances**


- Many thanks to Kirstin Leighton, PC Treasurer
- Received 2024/25 CEC allocation: £1501.60
- Still have not received CEC allocation for 2023/24 – this has been escalated
- 2024 SSF applications have closed
  - £5401 requested £3759 available
- Refreshments fundraising at School events
- Closing balance: £2419.54
- ParentPay balance: £1073.84





#### Recent issues

- Discussed a wide range of issues with the School leadership – many thanks for their engagement and responses
  - Communication with parents
  - New attainment reports
  - S1 Residential
  - Duke of Edinburgh Award opportunities
  - Fundraising for English texts







To support the School's efforts to get traction with the CEC, in December 2024 the Parent Council wrote to Councillors

- Noting significant negative impacts on pupils both in specific subjects, and in overall school experience – particularly for those with additional support needs
- 2. Requesting that CEC recognises and fully factors in these impacts, when considering the suitability of the school estate and determining school capacity.





- PC has had support from Councillors particular Steve Burgess and Tim Podgson, Joan Griffiths and Neil Ross, to whom many thanks
- CEC officers met with School team on 21 January to explore ways increase access to practical classrooms and social spaces – possible solutions are now being investigated
- PC received letter 24 January 2025 from CEC Head Of Inclusion Dr Lynne Binnie, outlining projected pupil numbers over coming years, and actions underway

Pupil number is not predicted to drop for 5 years – medium term solutions needed





- A report was taken to the Education, Children and Families Committee (ECFC) on 21
  November 2024 to approve the revised planning capacities for all Secondary
  Schools
  - Current JGHS capacity = 1800; proposed capacity 2025/26 = 1855
- Specific suitability issues raised by Headteachers.
- ECFC has requested review of these cases in March 2025





- Action: Scope for repurposing and reconfiguration of existing spaces alongside the use of some additional space - to provide increased practical subject facilities and improved social space.
- Action: PC concerns regarding the suitability of the space especially those with ASN have been shared with senior leaders at James Gillespie's and local authority.
- Action: School reviewing travel time between campuses, inc. impact on extracurricular activities; S6 study spaces; communications with PSLs



# Co-scheduling of Highers in 2025 exam diet



- SQA Higher English and Higher Psychology on 7 May 2025
- PC contacted a range of decision makers to request Higher English is not timetabled on the same day as any other Higher
- Proposed that contingency day on 2 June is used to reschedule Psychology to avoid any additional clashes negatively impacting other pupils

# Co-scheduling of Highers in 2025 exam diet

- Received positive engagement with Daniel Johnson MSP
- AS of 27 January 2025, SQA have written to the Cabinet Secretary "outlining an approach which [they] believe will provide a solution to the issue...highlighted".
- Awaiting agreement watch this space!









#### Other activities



- Engagement with City of Edinburgh Council updates
  - Following the review of Inclusion policies at CEC, JGHS PC and several other PCs, wrote to local councillors requesting better engagement and consultation with parents of children with additional support needs
  - Now have been a number of meetings hosted by CEC officers where the new structures to support pupils with ASN were presented more fully and feedback taken


